

Notice of Upcoming Property Revaluation

Municipalities throughout the State of New Jersey are required to conduct a real property revaluation every 10 years or so. The Morris County Board of Taxation has ordered the Township of Boonton to conduct a revaluation for the year of 2028, which will be in place for 2029. The last revaluation in Boonton Township was in 2014.

Accordingly, the Township Committee will be authorizing a revaluation request for proposals for these services. The sooner the proposals are made the faster the Township can lock in and hopefully secure lower price for the project. It is important to note that revaluation does not mean taxes will increase for everyone. In fact, the purpose is to promote fairness in market values

The overall goal is fairness and transparency to all Township residents. As such, we are letting you know of this first step. We will continue to keep you apprised of the process, which generally takes about three years, and schedule public information sessions so all residents are informed.
